Each week we will have an Eco Tip for the  
Congregation from Carmen and the EcoChurch group:

### This Week's Eco Tip

**White Distilled Vinegar:** An essential item for the  
shopping list! White distilled vinegar is non-toxic,  
natural and cheap (80p for 350ml). Its 5% acidity  
content can dissolve dirt and grease, and also kills some bacteria.  
However, **WARNING** - because vinegar is acidic it may damage  
some metals and will remove anti glare properties from electronic  
screens.



- ▶ For windows - mix 2 tablespoons of white vinegar with 1 gallon of water and spray onto windows. Wipe off with a dry cloth.
- ▶ For counter tops - disinfect with a solution of 1 part water to 2 parts vinegar. (Do not use on granite, marble or natural stone).
- ▶ For carpet stains, like wine - mix 1 tablespoon of liquid hand washing detergent and 1 tablespoon of white vinegar with 2 cups of warm water. Apply a little at a time using a clean cloth or sponge, blotting frequently with a dry cloth until the stain disappears. Vacuum when dry.
- ▶ Other uses - removing sticky label residue, cleaning dishwashers, softening towels and cleaning toilets.

## The Collect

Almighty God,

## First Reading

*Jeremiah 17.5-10*

Thus says the LORD:  
Cursed are those who trust in mere mortals  
and make mere flesh their strength,  
whose hearts turn away from the LORD.  
They shall be like a shrub in the desert,  
and shall not see when relief comes.  
They shall live in the parched places of the wilderness,  
in an uninhabited salt land.

Blessed are those who trust in the LORD,  
whose trust is the LORD.  
They shall be like a tree planted by water,  
sending out its roots by the stream.  
It shall not fear when heat comes,  
and its leaves shall stay green;  
in the year of drought it is not anxious,  
and it does not cease to bear fruit.

The heart is devious above all else;  
it is perverse –  
who can understand it?  
I the LORD test the mind  
and search the heart,  
to give to all according to their ways,  
according to the fruit of their doings.

## Second Reading

*1 Corinthians 15.12-20*

If Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead? If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ – whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and

you are still in your sins. Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died.

## Gospel

*Luke 6.17-26*

He came down with them and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast of Tyre and Sidon. They had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases; and those who were troubled with unclean spirits were cured. And all in the crowd were trying to touch him, for power came out from him and healed all of them.

Then he looked up at his disciples and said:

'Blessed are you who are poor,  
for yours is the kingdom of God.

'Blessed are you who are hungry now,  
for you will be filled.

'Blessed are you who weep now,  
for you will laugh.

'Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice on that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets.

'But woe to you who are rich,  
for you have received your consolation.

'Woe to you who are full now,  
for you will be hungry.

'Woe to you who are laughing now,  
for you will mourn and weep.

'Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets.

## Post Communion Prayer

Merciful Father,  
who gave Jesus Christ to be for us the bread of life,  
that those who come to him should never hunger:  
draw us to the Lord in faith and love,  
that we may eat and drink with him  
at his table in the kingdom,  
where he is alive and reigns, now and for ever. Amen.
