Each week we have an Eco Tip for the Congregation from Carmen and the EcoChurch group:

This Week's Eco Tip: Gardening Tips

Recyclable tree guards.

Tree guards or tubes are an effective method of protecting against this damage. Plastic has commonly been used for tree guards but it does not biodegrade nor is it environmentally friendly. Alternatives to plastic are being extensively trialled and evaluated. These include guards made from card with a cellulose coating, wood, wire, coir, plant starch and nut shells such as cashew. Research into this is being supported by organizations such as the Woodland Trust and various Forestry Trusts. Grown Green (growinggreen.co.uk) guards will last more than two years, are available in a variety of sizes and can be fitted with or without a cane

All Amen. First Reading

Lamentations 3.22-26,31-33

The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases,
his mercies never come to an end;
they are new every morning;
great is your faithfulness.
'The LORD is my portion,' says my soul,
'therefore I will hope in him.'

The LORD is good to those who wait for him,
to the soul that seeks him.
It is good that one should wait quietly
for the salvation of the LORD.

For the Lord will not
reject for ever.
Although he causes grief, he will have compassion
according to the abundance of his steadfast love;
for he does not willingly afflict
or grieve anyone.

Second Reading

2 Corinthians 4.16 - 5.4

So we do not lose heart. Even though our outer
nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being
renewed day by day. For this slight momentary
affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of

glory beyond all measure, because we look not at
what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for
what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be
seen is eternal.

For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is
destroyed, we have a building from God, a house
not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. For in
this tent we groan, longing to be clothed with our
heavenly dwelling – if indeed, when we have taken it
off we will not be found naked. For while we are still
in this tent, we groan under our burden, because we
wish not to be unclothed but to be further clothed,
so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life.

Gospel

John 6.35-40

Jesus said to the crowd, 'I am the bread of life.
Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and
whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. But I
said to you that you have seen me and yet do not
believe. Everything that the Father gives me will
come to me, and anyone who comes to me I will
never drive away; for I have come down from
heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him
who sent me. And this is the will of him who sent
me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has
given me, but raise it up on the last day. This is
indeed the will of my Father, that all who see the
Son and believe in him may have eternal life; and I
will raise them up on the last day.'

Post Communion Prayer

Father in heaven,
whose Church on earth
is a sign of your heavenly peace,
an image of the new and eternal Jerusalem:
grant to us in the days of our pilgrimage
that, fed with the living bread of heaven,
and united in the body of your Son,
